The NeW Speakers Bureau: Thank you for all of your work as a leader for NeW! We are excited to support you and help you put together events that will inspire and educate your peers. We want these events to serve as a recruitment tool for you, both as a unique experience for current members and to bring in new members. In addition to the event itself, many speakers are willing to do a meal or coffee with NeW leadership before or after the event, a great experience to offer those more involved with NeW as a thank you.

The organizations and speakers on this list are not exhaustive of all the options but highlight some of the best female speakers you can bring to host a dynamic event on campus. While the biographies listed and event topic ideas will give you insight into what each person can cover, the speakers can often cover other related topics too. Many are also willing to go with other titles for the event to help with promotion if you think another title/focus would draw a wider audience. Please select the titles and topics based on what would work for your campus. Ask us if you need a recommendation for a specific topic or idea!

There are a number of speakers, such as Katie Pavlich, Rachel Campos Duffy, Lisa Boothe, and others, who we are happy to have you bring to campus too. However, there is a larger attendance threshold, and you must be confident you would get at least 75 people there.

A few additional key notes:

- This list is for internal use only by NeW leaders, not to be distributed or shared with the public.
- Ideally invite the person at least four weeks in advance. This gives optimal time for promotion and to maximize the number of people who will attend the event.
- Create the event on at least one platform, so it can be shared across campus. Select a dynamic event title and event description, so people read the event and instantly want to attend. We are happy to help you with this!
- Remember, we are here to help you with promotion, to share on our national social media, create graphics, whatever we can do to help you be successful. Just ask!
- When inviting a speaker, please feel confident you could get a minimum of 20 attendees at the event. When considering who to bring, please keep in mind the amount of travel the person would have to do. If it's a further trip for them, please aim for a higher attendance. Consider co-sponsoring the event with another group on campus to connect with a larger audience.
- Take advantage of the speakers in your state, as most will travel at no cost and the threshold for attendance can be lower.
- Work with your campus to secure any possible funding: to bring in the speaker, pay her honorarium, and have food and drinks at the event.
- If you schedule an event with a speaker from this list, please let us know so that we can help promote.
- You can host multiple speakers a semester, so take advantage of this list and our support!

Speaker Ideas: As you consider ideas for who to bring to campus, here are some ideas to consider:

- **Elected Officials:** In addition to national officeholders, these can be state representatives, local representatives, or individuals who previously served.
- **Journalists:** Whether from a local paper, national paper, or a conservative or libertarian publication, many journalists are great speakers to host.
- **Policy Experts:** Think tank analysts, attorneys, and individuals who specialize in a policy issue.
- **Private Sector Leaders:** Business owners and other private sector leaders can speak on the business side of policy or offer more professional advice. In addition, you could have someone who's an industry expert or works in a given field, such as teachers for education issues, doctors on health care, etc.
- **Professors:** Faculty members who are experts on a specific area or have general focus on political science, foreign policy, economics, etc. can also deliver remarks on their area of expertise.

Speaker Databases: These are websites you can visit to search for conservative, libertarian, and independent policy speakers:

- **Find Scholars:** The Institute for Humane Studies put together Find Scholars as a database of independent scholars who are willing to speak at events.
- **PolicyExperts.org:** This is database of speakers put together by the Heritage Foundation. You can search by issue area or expertise to find someone on a specific topic you are interested in. You can also search for specific names and or by location to find someone in your state. This is a great resource to learn what organizations and speakers exist in your state, so they would be more easily available to speak.
- **State Policy Network:** State Policy Network is the umbrella organization for state-based think tank organizations. There is a SPN affiliate organization in every state, so find the ones <u>in your state</u>. Many of their staff are policy experts, so can speak about a specific policy issue or issues relevant to your state.

Coalition Resources: To find a complete list of coalition organizations, search policyexperts.org. These organizations (and many others) are willing to send their staff and experts to campus to speak. Many are willing to travel, but costs and availability vary:

- **American Enterprise Institute:** As a leading national think tank, AEI has scholars who focus on a wide range of issues.
- **Cato Institute:** As a leading libertarian think tank, Cato has scholars for most policy topics.



- **Heritage Foundation:** As the largest conservative think tank, Heritage has a wide range of experts on topics and issue areas.
- **National Review Institute:** The National Review Institute will partner to bring speakers to campus.
- **Pacific Legal Foundation:** The Pacific Legal Foundation litigates nationwide, and their lawyers focus on topics including property rights, economic liberty, equality before the law, the separation of powers, and free speech and association.

Other Event Ideas: If you're interested in hosting a movie screening, the Moving Picture Institute and Causumentary both offer support for events. They often provide additional materials or help when your screen one of their films, such as help lining up a speaker or swag.

Cary currently chairs the advisory board of the George and Barbara Bush Foundation, where she has been a member since 2004. The Bush Foundation oversees the George H.W. Bush Presidential Library and Museum and the Bush School of Government & Public Service, with campuses at Texas A&M University and in Washington, D.C. Following her tenure at the White House, Cary served as spokesman and deputy director of policy and communications for U.S. Attorney General William Barr and deputy director of communications at the Republican National Committee under Chairman Haley Barbour. Mona Charen is a syndicated columnist Policy Editor of *The Bulwark.* Ms. Charen received her undergraduate degree at Barnard College, Columbia University, with honors. She also holds a degree in law from George Washington University. Ms. Charen began her career at National Review magazine where she served as editorial assistant. On her first tax return at the age of 22, Ms. Charen listed her occupation as "pundit," explaining later, "You have to think big." In 1984, Ms. Charen joined the White



House staff, serving first as Nancy Reagan's speechwriter and later as Associate Director of the Office of Public Liaison. In the latter post, she lectured widely on the Administration's Central America policy. Later in her White House career, she worked in the Public Affairs office helping to craft the President's communications strategy. In 1986, Ms. Charen left the White House to join the presidential campaign of then-Congressman Jack Kemp as a speechwriter. Ms. Charen launched her syndicated column in 1987. It has become one of the most widely read columns in the industry and is featured in more than 150 newspapers and websites. She spent 6 years as a regular commentator on CNN's Capital Gang and Capital Gang Sunday and has served as a judge of the Pulitzer Prizes. She has also been a fellow at the Hudson Institute and the Jewish Policy Center. Ms. Charen is the author of two bestsellers: *Useful Idiots: How Liberals Got it Wrong in the Cold War and Still Blame America First* (2003); and *Do-Gooders: How Liberals Harm Those They Claim to Help – and the Rest of Us* (2005). In 2010, she received the Eric Breindel Award for Excellence in Opinion Journalism.

She completed her service in the Reagan administration as deputy undersecretary of the Interior Department and as assistant interior secretary for fish, wildlife, and parks. Dunlop is one of the few of the insiders from the beginnings of the Reagan era who remain active in public policy leadership. As Virginia's natural resources chief, Dunlop worked to streamline, decentralize, and down-size agencies while protecting and improving the environment. She is one of the few ,free-market environmentalists to have headed a state agency and put ideas into action. Her book, *Clearing the Air*, (Alexis de Tocqueville Institute, 2000), chronicles some of her experiences in advancing those principles.
