NeW promotes conservative ideas on campus and encourages the intellectual diversity that is often lacking in the classroom. This spring, chapters brought in speakers and hosted discussions on topics such as protecting women's sports, free speech, and antisemitism.

NeW at Winthrop University was launched this semester. The chapter's event with Riley Gaines on March 24, 2025 was the chapter's first speaker event.




Rachel Boik and Nicole Kelly, members of NeW at Florida State University, enjoyed meeting Riley Gaines on March 28, 2025.

The Council members act as partners, advocates, and active contributors toward growing the NeW Professional Network community.



Promoting Conservative Principles Online


